About my business

I provide instrumental tuition to individual students. At the date of this assessment I have 13 regular students. Before the COVID pandemic I taught all students at a local music school in a building which has shared washing and lavatory facilities, which is cleaned every night by staff. I have provided lessons online as an alternative to face-to-face teaching. I intend to offer a blend of face-to-face tuition and online tuition, in accordance with the preferences of my students and subject at all times to the advice, guidance or legislation of the UK/Scottish/Welsh/Northern Irish government. In this blend, I intend to offer face-to-face tuition in students' homes, in addition to the local music school. The local music school has an assessment which can be accessed on request.

How this risk assessment was done

This risk assessment is based on the method and principles of the Health & Safety Executive (HSE)'s COVID-19 risk assessment, including advice about coronavirus and safe working here: https://www.hse.gov.uk/coronavirus/working-safely/index.htm. The aim of this risk assessment is to identify how COVID-19 could spread in my teaching environment, and to identify methods to stop the spread of the virus. This assessment reflects any relevant official government guidance for safe working during the pandemic.

I identified hazards by communicating with students about entry and exit procedures, movement around their home, noting ventilation options within the space, considering instrument and equipment cleaning procedures and whether any items are shared. I have taken note of additional risks associated with wind instruments, and reflecting on travel and how I would get to students' properties. I also considered those who may be considered to be vulnerable who also live in my home, and also what measures to deploy if any COVID symptoms appear in me, my students or other members of my household.
